Hart County Head Start / Early Head Start / Pre-K (706-376-9355): Learning facility for children from 6 weeks until Kindergarten age within set income limits.

Hart County Senior Center/Regional Transportation (706-376-3975): In house programs for the over 60 population as well as regional transportation for all ages.

Hart Interdenominational Ministry - H.I.M. (706-377-4446): Financial Assistance for utility bills, rent, prescription medication, transportation or an expense that would have an adverse effect on earnings.
